

Invia Liberty – for Negative Pressure Wound Therapy



Negative Pressure Wound Therapy (NPWT) has become a preferred choice of care for treating acute and chronic wounds.

The Invia Liberty can be used both at the hospital and at home, easing transition and facilitating continuity of care.

The ease of use, quiet operation and compact size makes it a device that can be carried in a discreet bag, facilitating mobility. The docking station allows for easy recharging of the unit.

Therapy data can be checked on the built-in LCD screen or stored and uploaded to a PC.

Indications for Use:

- Diabetic/Neuropathic ulcers
- Pressure or venous insufficiency ulcers
- Chronic wounds
- Traumatic wounds
- Acute or sub-acute wounds
- Dehisced wounds
- Partial thickness burns
- Flaps and Grafts

Contraindications:

- Malignancy in the wound
- Untreated osteomyelitis
- Non-enteric and unexplored fistulas
- Necrotic tissue with eschar present exposed vasculature
- Exposed vasculature
- Exposed nerves
- Exposed anastomotic site
- Exposed organs
- Malnourished patients
- Pediatric use
