# **NEBULIZER MACHINES**

**GENERAL:** A nebulizer machine delivers a mist of medication to be inhaled into the lungs.

**MEDICATIONS:** Your doctor has ordered medications for use in the nebulizer to relax the airways, or treat / prevent inflammation in the airways.

Always take the nebulizer medication as ordered by your doctor. If you have question or concerns about medication dosage or if you experience any side effects...<u>CALL YOUR DOCTOR.</u>

### **GETTING STARTED**

- 1. Be sure the machine has a power source electrical outlet, battery pack, or car adaptor.
- 2. Assemble the **NEBULIZER CUP SET**.
- 3. Add the medication that your doctor has ordered.
- 4. Attach the nebulizer cup set to the nebulizer machine, either as in "A" directly to the machine, or "B" with the supply tubing.



### **DISINFECTION & CLEANING**

#### Never submerge the unit. Always unplug unit before cleaning.

After each treatment rinse medication cup and parts with warm water then air-dry on a clean cloth or paper towel. **NOTE: SUPPLY TUBING SHOULD NOT BE WASHED!** 

At the end of each day:

- Wash medication cup parts in warm water and mild hand or dishwashing soap and rinse well with warm water.
- Soak for 15 minutes in: 1 PART WHITE VINEGAR / 3 PARTS WATER
- Rinse well and let air dry on clean cloth or paper towel.

Filter changes will depend on how often the doctor has instructed you to use the nebulizer machine. The filter will look gray or brown in color when a change is needed.
